Here's our main maintenance and care advice tips:

- 1. Most manufacturers provide maintenance and care advice for the items they produce. Ensure to read their care advice and follow it. Failure do so can make the manufacturer's guarantee invalid.
- 2. To maintain the appearance of your furniture we recommend regular dusting with a soft cloth.
- 3. Some of our natural oak ranges will need oiling over time. Ensure to oil this furniture as recommended by the manufacturer,
- 4. Harsh detergents or cleaners should be avoided.
- 5. Keep furniture away from direct heat or sunlight as much as possible as the heat and sunlight can damage your furniture.
- 6. Spills should be moped up immediately to prevent liquid stains.
- 7. The use of coasters, placemats and table cloths is recommended for hot items placed on furniture.
- 8. Take care when moving furniture as dragging pieces across a floor will cause damage to the joints. We recommend that larger items are lifted by 2 people.

When you purchase your new table and chairs and/or dining furniture you'll want each piece to be in proportion to the size of the room and indeed other items that will also reside there. So it always makes sense to measure your space first. To visualise the size, it is a good idea to lay out newspaper or masking tape to the size of your furniture so you can see how much room it takes up. Don't forget to allow for extra room for the chairs when pulled out or any extension leaves that may be built into the table. Be mindful too if you are mixing and matching chair and table combinations that the there is enough room from the bottom of the table apron to the tops of the thighs when someone is seated.



Our product specification sheets that you'll find on our website or in our store gives the overall dimensions of the majority of the furniture we sell. These measurements include height (h), width (w), depth (d) and length (l) when applicable. All our measurements are in centimetres (cms) unless otherwise stated. This visual representation can be a very quick way of confirming one way or another if you are choosing correctly.

We also strongly recommend that you consider the access to your kitchen or dining room when your furniture is delivered. Some items we sell come fully assembled and may have difficulty squeezing up a stairs or through a door. We do however sell some furniture that has removable legs etc. that can address these issues. If this is a potential issue, ask us about these options.
